Across Europe, far right movements are strengthening, while mainstream parties move towards more restrictive border and immigration policies, undermining rights and worsening the situation for migrants.

While more migrant voices are heard and seen in the coverage of migration issues these days the under/mis-representation of migrants in media and political narratives is as prevalent as ever.

This panel discussion will look at the current state of affairs and how migration can be depoliticised.

This discussion will look at how political decisions can create injustices leading to individuals ending up in limbo outside the justice system.

What can we learn from scandals such as Windrush and TOEIC (international students falsely accused of cheating on English language tests), and how campaigners can overcome the challenges to achieve justice.

Workshop 1 Immigration policy: Inhumanity as political choice

This workshop will look at what to expect from the coming Border Security Bill and the lessons learned from campaigning against previous immigration bills.

Workshop 2 Meet the press

This workshop will focus on how we can engage with the media, hearing from journalists about how migrants can be better represented in coverage about migration. We will also be presenting our media analysis of the election coverage.

Workshop 3 Creatively changing migrants' representation

This workshop will explore how you can use creative tools to promote the representation of migrants in public spaces. Focusing on exhibition and cultural spaces and telling our stories directly through visual mediums.

16:00 - 17:00 Panel discussion: The cost of migration: paying to work

This panel will look at the global fight for the rights of migrant workers, including successive governments' attempts to stop agencies making people pay to find work. Now this has been replaced by the same governments charging extortionate visa fees for the ability to work. The panel will delve into how current visa systems and costs can create exploitation and precariousness.
